Teatro Romano

The oldest monument in Malaga City. It is situated in the cultural heart of Malaga and the only remaining Roman ruins in Andalucía after centuries of warfare, and construction.



Alcazaba de Malaga

This fortress palace, whose name in Arabic means citadel is visited because of its history and beauty. With the Roman Theatre, this special corner offers the chance to observe Roman, Arab and Renaissance culture.
