The Prado Museum

Designed by architect Juan de Villanueva in 1785. There we can contemplate some of the greatest masterpieces made by Bosch, El Greco, Goya, Velázquez and more.

Plaza de Toros

Part of Spain's heritage and culture, the construction of the bullring "Las Ventas" was finished in 1929. It is the third largest bullring in the world.

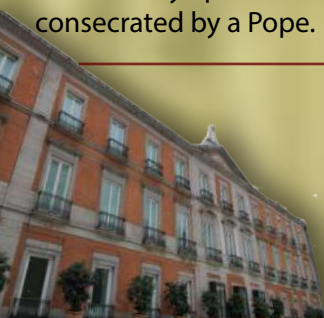


Puerta de Alcalá

Completed in 1769, when Carlos III demanded a flamboyant gate for the city. The official inauguration was in 1778. There's an interesting story behind this monument.

Madrid Cathedral

The Catedral de Santa María la Real de la Almudena was started in 1883 and not completed until 1993. It is the only Spanish cathedral to have been consecrated by a Pope.



Thyssen – Bornemisza Museum

Art museum located near the Prado Museum, where visitors can appreciate an overview of art from the 13th century to the late 20th century, including periods of western art such as the Renaissance, Baroque, Rococo and Romanticism.
